MARKETPLACE CREATED TO SUPPORT LOCAL BUSINESSES


GRANT TO FAST TRACK PROJECTS AND SUPPORT BUSINESS

Council will fast track a number of road and community infrastructure projects, after accepting more than \$870,000 in Federal Government grant funding in August.

The Department of Infrastructure, Transport and Regional Development, through the Local Roads and Community Infrastructure (LRCI) Program, aims to assist a community-led recovery from COVID-19 by supporting local jobs, firms, and procurement.

The grant funding, which will be allocated as part of Council's COVID-19 Support Package Stage Three with projects to be announced in the coming months, must be completed by 30 June 2021.





COUNCIL REGISTERED AS COVID SAFE BUSINESS

Council has shown its commitment to the health and safety of the community and its staff by officially being registered as a COVID Safe business. COVID Safe is an NSW Government program established to support businesses to keep the community safe from COVID-19.

MAJOR PROJECTS



PLAYGROUNDS RECEIVE UPGRADES

Equipment in five playgrounds across the Camden area have been replaced with brand new structures, as part of Council's \$300,000 Infrastructure Renewal Program for 2019-20. They include:

- Manna Gum Reserve, Narellan Vale;
- Little Reserve, Camden;
- Eastlewood Reserve, Narellan;
- Solander Reserve, Mount Annan; and
- Harrington Park Lake Reserve, Harrington Park.

RABY ROAD UPGRADE DESIGN

Camden Council, in partnership with Campbelltown City Council and Transport NSW, has a funding agreement with the NSW Government to prepare designs for the future upgrade of Raby Road. The concept design proposes the road be upgraded to a four-lane divided sub-arterial road, between Emerald Hills Boulevard and Thunderbolt Drive, with new intersections at Gledswood Hills Drive and Thunderbolt Drive.

The project is currently at concept design phase and is nearing completion.

LEPPINGTON STATION TEMPORARY CAR PARK COMPLETE

Council is proud to have delivered a temporary car park at Leppington Train Station, on behalf of Transport for NSW, with approximately 250 spaces.

The temporary car park, located opposite the station on Rickard Road, will help commuters find parking easily, with a number of spaces in the current car park unavailable during the construction of the NSW Government's 1,000 space multi-storey car park.

MAJOR PROJECTS

NARELLAN SPORTS HUB STAGE TWO

Camden is on track to become a sporting mecca, with Stage Two construction works starting at Narellan Sports Hub.

Funding has been received from the Western Sydney Parkland City Liveability Program, at \$11.3 million, and the Greater Sydney Sports Facility Fund, at \$5 million, for the design and construction of the Narellan Sports Hub Stage Two works in 2019.

Stage Two works will include 14 additional netball courts with floodlighting; a synthetic athletics track; and additional international size rugby league; and so much more!

The works will further enhance Narellan Sports Hub after Council delivered the \$11 million Stage One in October 2017, which included 30 high quality netball courts, expansive amenities building and car park.



STREETSCAPE IMPROVEMENTS

Works to improve accessibility and regional connectivity across Elderslie, Currans Hill and Spring Farm have commenced.

The construction of new footpaths and streetscape improvements will be carried out at the below five project sites, costing more than \$700,000:

- Downes Reserve shared path, Currans Hill;
- Throsby Reserve footpath, Currans Hill;
- Springs Road footpath and streetscape, Spring Farm;
- Lodges Road footpath and streetscape, Elderslie; and
- Liz Kernohan Drive (Link Road) footpath and streetscape, Elderslie.



DID YOU KNOW?

Local roads have received \$3.79 million worth of upgrades as part of Council's 2019-20 Road Improvement program. The annual program focusses on maintaining the Camden area's road network including resealing, traffic adjustments, path reconstructions, bus stops and much more.

FLOATING WETLANDS INSTALLED AT HARRINGTON PARK LAKE

Harrington Park Lake's water quality is set to improve after floating wetlands were installed at the upstream wetlands recently.

Council secured \$20,000 in funding from the Australian Government's Communities Environment Program to install a floating wetland, which consists of a suspended raft planted with wetland seedlings. The plants and their roots assist with removal of blue-green algal blooms including nutrients and help settle sediments in the water.

HARRINGTON FOREST RESTORATION BEGINS

Works to restore Harrington Forest's Cumberland Plain Woodland began recently, including weed treatment to help regenerate native vegetation in the area.

Council successfully secured funding of \$20,000 from the Australian Government's Communities Environment Program 2019–20 this year, with works aiming to enhance and protect the only ecological community of its kind in western Sydney.

The works, expected to be completed by February 2021, include:

- Removal of woody weeds throughout the five-hectare project site; and
- Citizen science activities with the Bushcare group to install 10 nest boxes for native birds and mammals within the restored site.

CAMDEN UNITES WITH MACARTHUR FC

Local footballers will have a chance to get closer to their A-League heroes, after Council committed more than \$20,000 in sponsorship to Macarthur FC.

The A-League's newest club representing the greater Macarthur region will have a direct connection to Camden residents through:

- School holiday activities, including four school holiday clinics for local juniors in the Camden area;
- Macarthur FC players to assist in promotion of Council programs;
- New resident engagement;
- Macarthur FC to be invited to participate in Council events;
- Promotion of Macarthur FC through Camden area including banners: and
- Council to provide up to 20 hours to field and amenities usage for training purposes to Macarthur FC.

LIBRARY STRATEGIC PLAN

Council is developing a Library Strategic Plan, which will help guide the future of its libraries. In September, we welcomed feedback from visitors through pop-up sessions and consultation stations to find out what you would like to see.

POPULAR CAMDEN TOWN FARM WALKWAY TURNS ONE

Camden's Miss Llewella Davies Pioneer Walkway has become a popular walking track, particularly through COVID-19, with hundreds of visitors on a weekly basis.

Celebrating its first birthday recently, the walkway, located at Camden Town Farm, covers riparian zones, pastoral, grazing and cropping paddocks, offers fantastic views of St Johns Church, the Chinese Washing Wells, the Nepean River and Macquarie House.

Camden Town Farm was bequeathed to Council by Miss Llewella Davies, who wanted the property to be left to the community for their benefit and enjoyment and I believe she would be glad to see its current use.

The walkway remains open. Residents are reminded dogs are not permitted on the walkway and to ensure they maintain physical distancing during the walk.

NEW KIDS E-RESOURCE TO TEACH KIDS NEW LANGUAGE

Local children can now learn a second language with ease, with Camden Libraries increasing access to their online eResources.

Languages other than English (LOTE) Online for Kids is a new children's eResource, including digital books in over 20 languages with English translations, available for children aged up to 12 years.

Camden Libraries also offer a range of other eResources for members, including eBooks; eAudio; eComics; eMagazines; eResearch; online tutoring; and online software training.

Camden Libraries also remain open to the public with a number of restrictions in place.

ALL-IN-ONE RECYCLING STATIONS DEVELOPED FOR CAMDEN

Printer cartridges can now be recycled in a newly developed all-in-one recycling station available at three locations across the Camden area.

The new stations, which allow the community to recycle printer cartridges, household batteries and mobile phones, can be found at the Camden Council Administration Building, Narellan Library and Camden Library.

Residents can also recycle their phones at participating 'Mobile Muster' drop off centres in the Camden area, while also recycling their printer cartridges at all Officeworks stores and participating Australia Post, Cartridge World, Harvey Norman, The Good Guys, JB Hi-Fi, Office National and Office Products Depot outlets.

A free E-Waste service is also available to residents and small businesses in the Camden local government area at the Spring Farm Resource Recovery Park located at 20 Barrow Road, Spring Farm.

HABITAT STAG TREES

While it might look a little strange, this tree is a 'habitat tree'. You may have seen one of these while you have been out and about across the Camden area.

Tree hollows can take over 100 years to form, which means they are becoming rarer in Camden. Where there is an opportunity to safely retain the trunk and branches of large trees that have been damaged, Council will try to do so as a way of retaining important habitat for local wildlife.

The branches are used as perches for birds, bats and small mammals, and the hollows are used by mammals and birds as nesting locations. You can see the scratch marks on the trunk from the possum that calls this tree home.

COBBITTY HILLS LANDHOLDER GUIDE

A landholder guide is available for people living in the Cobbitty Hills area that have important remnant native bushland on their land.

The bushland that makes up the Cobbitty Hills biodiversity corridor supports a wide range of native animals and plants, including threatened and endangered species and communities

The majority of this bushland is located on private land, so a guide has been developed to assist landholders who are interested in protecting and improving the native vegetation on their property with practical information, including ways to generate income through conservation.

Trees are a vital part of the ecosystem, not just in bushland and parks, but also in backyards, streets and urban areas, where they play a number of important roles.


Trees provide shade to cool our streets and help to clean the air we breathe. Trees also make our streets more beautiful, softening the urban environment and providing privacy and a sense of place.

Because trees are such an important part of the growing urban environment and to create a sustainable, liveable and cool place. Camden Council aims to retain trees in the landscape wherever this is possible.

All tree removal, pruning and clearing of vegetation on private or public land within the Camden Local Government Area requires approval from Council.

CHILD RESTRAINT FITTING AND CHECKING DAY

Council runs four free Child Restraint Fitting and Checking Days per year, where you can have your child car restraints, harnesses and booster seats checked for safety and correct fit.

The next event is tentatively scheduled for Thursday 10 December 2020 (dependant on current restrictions).

Drivers with children, who are not safely fastened in the correct child car seat, may face a \$337 fine and loss of three demerit points.
