Camden Mayor hosts Minister for Local Government

Council's leading role in promotion of responsible pet ownership, the Camden local government area's rapid growth, it's aspirational 2014/15 Delivery Program and how Camden Council and the State government can continue to work in partnership were topics high on the agenda for discussion for Mayor of Camden, Councillor Lara Symkowiak, together with State Member for Camden, Chris Patterson MP, as Minister for Local Government, The Honourable Paul Toole MP visited Camden today.

"Paws in the Park, one of Camden's premier events, allows Council to educate the community on responsible pet ownership in a fun, family friendly environment. The popularity of this event continues to grow, as demonstrated by the increase in attendees over the past three years, and we anticipate seeing even more people this year in August".

"Camden is dedicated to being a leader in promoting responsible pet ownership and I hope that the Minister can use Camden as an example for other Council's to follow" she said.

The Mayor also discussed Council's range of major capital works projects outlined in its recently adopted Delivery Program which will see a \$20 million investment into the community.

"I was pleased to discuss with Minister Toole my Council's prudent financial management, as demonstrated in the 2014/15 Delivery Program adopted by Council on Tuesday night. Not only was I able to highlight that
