Draft Camden urban design framework on exhibition

The key urban design principles and concepts that will guide planning for the Camden town centre are now on public exhibition for community comment.

Following the adoption of the Camden Town Centre Vision in April 2015, Council has been working closely with specialist consultants and the community to develop the draft Camden Town Centre Urban Design framework.

The framework addresses the built form, current use of spaces, access and movement through the town centre and looks at the economics, natural environment and public domain with the underlying goal of maintaining Camden's rural heritage and charm.

In addition to the broad principles and urban design framework, the draft document also identifies and investigates four precincts at Larkin Place, John Street, Murray Street and the Nepean River.

Each precinct has been designed to accommodate an important element of a productive town including commercial, cultural and civic elements as well as the natural and built environment.

The draft Camden Town Centre Urban Design Framework is available for further public comment 24 April to 8 June and can be viewed on Council's website and in hard copy at the local libraries.

Information kiosks will be held at Camden Library 6pm-8pm, Tuesday 1 May and on the corner of John Street and Argyle Street 10am-12pm, Friday 4 May and 10am-12pm, Saturday 5 May.
